Chalk Art at Wren & Ayers

Renowned chalk artist **Mark Wagner** has brought his talents to **Valhalla Elementary** for the last few years. We discovered him via our survey and were thrilled when he was willing to replicate his program at additional MDUSD schools.

He visited **Ayers Elementary** on May 11th, and **Wren Arts Magnet Elementary School** on May 31st, providing school-wide assemblies and time throughout the day for every single student to participate in a massive chalk project on their blacktop.

Mark's new goal for 2018-19 is a "World's Largest Illustrated Story," to encompass all MDUSD elementary schools over the course of the school year, telling the story of our district's relationship with Mt Diablo using each of our school mascots.

Five Art Trials Completed!

Art in Action, a nonprofit that provides online, Common Core-aligned, grade level, hands-on art curricula, donated free trial codes for teachers. This spring, five teachers from five different schools piloted an Art in Action lesson before the end of the school year. We provided supplies and observed those classes at **Bel Air, Fair Oaks, Hidden Valley, Mt Diablo,** and **Sun Terrace Elementary Schools**, and plan to fund a wider pilot at those schools for 2018- 2019.

Finances

In its inaugural year, the foundation raised a total of \$46,807.54

through a combination of grants and donations. In all, 85 contributions were received, 11 from repeat donors. A robust set of financial protocols, including independent auditing, were established to ensure responsible stewardship of our donors' contributions.
