

The foundation was excited to fund the **mural project at Olympic High School.** In collaboration with local professional artist and MDUSD alumnus **Jesse Hernandez** of **Urban Aztec Design**, Olympic High students designed and painted a stunning social justice-themed mural on their campus.

The foundation also continued its partnership with renowned chalk artist **Mark Wagner**, providing the opportunity for MDUSD elementary students to create blacktop chalk art—an illustrated story using elementary school mascots—and with **Art in Action**, a nonprofit organization that provides Common Core-aligned, grade level, hands-on art curricula to our elementary students.








The foundation continued its collaboration with the **Growing Healthy Kids** program, formerly known as the **MDUSD Garden Education Program**, in achieving its goal of integrating farm-to-school efforts that support the whole student. With the foundation's help, the program started "farmstands" at several Title I elementary schools—buying healthy, fresh produce from local nonprofit farms and providing it to community families in exchange for an optional donation. The students helped by setting up, creating signage, working the stands, collecting donations, making change, and cleaning up, thereby improving their leadership skills while creating a lifelong connection to healthy eating!





EXPLORING This year, elementary students headed to the rocky coastline as the foundation, in partnership with **Exploring New** Horizons, funded day trips to Pigeon Point Lighthouse in Pescadero. Tidepool instruction and exploration were the order of the day as kids inspected crabs, sea anemones, urchins, sea stars, and other denizens of the not-too-deep. The foundation helped fund two technology and engineering initiatives at **Ygnacio Valley High School**. The **Femineer** program, managed in conjunction with **Cal Poly Pomona's Department of Engineering**, is designed to empower female student to pursue STEM majors and careers. Their year culminated with an end-of-the-year showcase of their many creations. **Project 212**, the Ygnacio Valley Robotics team, built their robot and participated in several robotics competitions throughout Northern California.





The foundation continued its partnership with Young Audiences of Northern California, with funding from the Dean and Margaret Lesher Foundation. We supported the Summer Arts Camp at Wren Avenue Arts Magnet Elementary, where students had fun learning drumming, circus performing, and poetry writing. This was followed up by Young Audiences' year-long teaching artist-in-residence program to produce and embed arts education in the curriculum. The foundation also continued its support of a competitive high school policy debate team through the Bay Area Urban Debate League.

Movement was definitely on the bill as the foundation partnered with **Diablo Ballet**, who brought their unique **PEEK Outreach** program to **Rio Vista Elementary** and **Sunrise Social Emotional Collaborative School**. The program teaches students to express their experiences and feelings

through original body movement and teamwork. Students created their own dramatic, yet silent, skits to demonstrate how to handle life's sometimes difficult situations.







The foundation hosted a hugely successful **Bocce Tournament** that raised over

\$20,000

for foundation programs.

Held in Clayton on a beautiful Saturday in May, 16 teams plus a throng of cheering spectators enjoyed a day of bocce, silent auction baskets, raffle baskets, and pizza. The competition was fierce yet friendly as teams worked the banks and angles to roll up points, all to benefit students.

The foundation also partnered with Yours Humanly as a beneficiary of their autumn **Break a Sweat for Education 5K Run**. After two years of Covid, it was exciting to be moving out and about in person again! The run was great fun and even better exercise. Best of all, **Yours Humanly** generously donated over \$10,000 from the run proceeds to help fund our marine science field trips.
